### **INCEST The Ultimate Betrayal**

Keynote Speaker

**Actress Jessica Hendra**

Actress/author Jessica Hendra ("Dejar" in *Star Trek: Deep Space Nine*) spent three decades protecting family secrets. In 2004 her comedian father Tony Hendra, former editor of the National Lampoon, published his memoir *Father Joe: The Man Who Saved My Soul*. Jessica read the memoir, found a glaring oversight in his confession, and made the wrenching decision to publicly confront him. This led to a New York Times investigation of Jessica's family secrets which shocked the literary world. She then wrote *How to Cook Your Daughter*, the memoir of her father's sins against her and the story of her painful decision to expose him.

### **RESEARCH ON EXTREME ABUSE**

Child sexual abuse is alarmingly common. It is reported by 30-40% of all US women. **Wanda Karriker, Ph.D.** will present her international research study of 1,500 extreme abuse survivors and the striking commonalities of their horrifying abuse experiences, including incest.

Two new films will be shown on Friday and Saturday. *Stories of Survival: Domestic Violence and Child Custody* by Sheila Wellstone Foundation presents histories of court-ordered abuse of protective parents and Courageous Kids. *Family Court Crisis: Our Children at Risk*, a powerful documentary produced by Marin County's Center for Judicial Excellence, describes family court system failure.

Author **Carolyn Lehman** will receive an award for *Strong At The Heart*, her book for and about sexually abused teens.

### **Are Incest Victims Safer Since The "Incest Exception" Was Removed?**

Panel: Law Enforcement and Sexual Assault/ Domestic Violence Agencies

In 2005 Senate Bill 33 (Battin) removed the outrageous CA Penal Code Section that permitted convicted incest perpetrators to receive a lesser penalty than other sexual abuse perpetrators, and be reunified with their families. Attorney General Jerry Brown, Yolo County District Attorney, Yolo County Sexual Assault and Domestic Violence and WEAVE are invited to discuss any changes in their assistance to incest victims after SB 33 passed.

International recording artist **Karie Hillery** will end the conference with music that "soothes as it heals," bringing hope and weaving a thread that reflects her lifelong commitment to peace for our world.
